



The Fulbridge Academy Pupil Premium funding

The Pupil Premium is funding paid to the school by means of a specific grant based on the following:

- School census figures for pupils registered as eligible for free school meals (FSM) in the last six years.
- The number of children who have been or are still in local authority care.

The Pupil Premium is additional to main school funding and will be used by The Fulbridge Academy to address any underlying inequalities and 'narrow the gap' in academic attainment for eligible pupils.

Objectives for Pupil Premium at The Fulbridge Academy

The Pupil Premium will be used to provide additional educational support to improve the progress and raise the standard of achievement for identified pupils. This support will be available via:

- EAL support for children and parents where appropriate
- SEN support
- Support for behaviour for learning
- Provide learning opportunities for PP identified children to close inequalities
- Provide experiences for PP identified children to close inequalities

The Fulbridge Academy Policy for Pupil Premium

The funding will be used to narrow and close the gap between the achievement of those pupils and their peers. The school will ensure the funding reaches the pupils who need it most and that it makes a significant impact on their education and lives. The learning and experiences funded by pupil premium will be allocated based on evidence-based research as to the most effective practices. The impact of the use of the funding will be audited regularly in order to ensure it is being used effectively to close the gap for the eligible pupils.

Pupil Premium Accountability Statement

The Principal and Senior Leadership Team will regularly and rigorously monitor, evaluate and review the strategies and interventions put in place for Pupil premium and report to the Governing Body on its progress and impact.

Breakfast Club £6000	To improve concentration of children in class by providing them with a nutritious breakfast. Additionally, promoting increased attendance.	61 pupil premium children attend Breakfast Club regularly. Attendance across the academy remains above expected standard of 97%. Classroom support based on % of pupil premium children across the school £114,330	Funding has helped us to ensure each classroom is supported by a minimum of one additional adult with a strong focus on supporting groups of vulnerable children in all aspects of the curriculum helping to close attainment gaps.	
EAL and SEND CPD £6200	Funding used to allow staff to attend appropriate CPD in order to support those children who are eligible for pupil premium.	Staff are more confident in supporting the needs of pupil premium children who are highlighted as SEND or EAL.
Learning Mentors Support £43,748	We employ a learning mentors team to support vulnerable children during the day through time spent within lessons and group work outside of the classroom. The team support pupil premium families as well as children within the school.	
Learning Support Teacher £20,330	To support vulnerable pupils with SEN, we employ a Learning Support Teacher in addition to our SENCo to reflect the needs we must address regarding pupil premium children.
