



The Fulbridge Academy Pupil Premium funding

Most schools with primary-age pupils receive the PE and sport premium in the academic year 2016 to 2017.

The Sports Premium is additional to main school funding and will be used by The Fulbridge Academy to address any underlying inequalities and 'narrow the gap' in Sport for eligible pupils.

Objectives for Sports Premium at The Fulbridge Academy

The Sports Premium will be spent by the Fulbridge Academy on making additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of all pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

The Sports Premium may be used to:

- Develop and add to the Sports activities already offered within the school
- Make sustainable improvements that will benefit pupils in future years to come

The Fulbridge Academy Policy for Pupil Premium

The Fulbridge Academy receives PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6.

The premium is calculated by determining how many pupils in the school attract the funding using data from the January 2016 school census.

Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil.

Pupil Premium Accountability Statement

The Principal and Senior Leadership Team will regularly and rigorously monitor, evaluate and review the strategies, training and expenditure put in place for the Sports Premium and report to the Governing Body on its progress and impact.

Curriculum Focus for Pupil Premium spending 2016/2017

Intervention	Cost	Rationale
England fencing training course	£662.20	Staff members trained in fencing in order to develop the PE curriculum by offering more varied approaches.
Archery equipment – Aim 4 Sport	£2419.96	Archery has been included within the PE curriculum at the Fulbridge to develop a wider approach to physical activities. Equipment purchased to offer this to all war groups.
Sporting Equipment Expenditure	£1708.69	Funding used to purchase a variety of sporting goods to replace old equipment and supply the Academy with high quality equipment used within the curriculum and for extra-curricular clubs.
Morning Fitness programme	£965.00	Morning fitness programmes are now run across the entire school for 10 minutes daily including parental and staff participation. Equipment, resources and licenses have been purchased to allow the sessions to run.
Fulbridge Academy Games	£ 436	Funding used to set up and deliver an inter school sports festival based on sporting competition with an Olympic focus.
Extra-curricular provision	£500	The Academy run a wide variety of sporting clubs for children of all ages. Each club requires a minimal amount of funding to support the equipment requirements.
Sport competition expenditure	£500	Funding used to allow children to compete in competitive games with other schools including kit, travel expenses and insurances for travel.
